About the Diocese of Fairbanks



The Most Reverend Donald J. Kettler was ordained Bishop of Fairbanks, August 22, 2002. Prior to his episcopal ordination, he served as a priest of the Sioux Falls Diocese, his personal motto is: “Faith, Hope and Love”.

Geographically, the Diocese of Fairbanks is the largest of the three Alaskan dioceses. It is also the largest Roman Catholic diocese in the United States, spanning approximately 409,849 square miles.

The diocese has 46 churches. Five are urban road parishes, four are rural road parishes and 37 are non-road mission parishes which are funded entirely through diocesan fund-raising efforts.

Over 50% of the diocese’s Roman Catholics are Native Alaskans.

The diocese contributes funding to the *Catholic Schools of Fairbanks*, a Pre-K through Grade 12 Catholic school, located in Fairbanks. <http://www.catholic-schools.org/>
